## INFORMATION



**DISPLAY & POKER RUN (Sat 6th Nov) & HILLCLIMB (Sun 7th Nov)** 

This year we would like to invite all motorcycle enthusiasts to join us for a fun filled weekend of motorcycling. The weekend starts on Saturday 6th Nov with a motorcycle display in Stirling Terrace. The road will be closed from 6am for setup, motorcycles to be displayed arrive at 8am, public viewing will be from 9am, followed by the Poker Run at lunchtime. The Poker Run, as with the display, is open to anyone with a road licensed motorcycle of any age and a license to ride it. It is a very popular event.

Entry fee is **\$10 per hand**, , and includes afternoon tea which is held afterwards at the Albany Rifle Club, on Frenchman's Bay Road. The poker run will finish at approximately 4pm.

Registrations for the 'Poker Run', will commence 8am Sat 6th Nov on Stirling Terrace (just outside Dylan's on The Terrace), and will **close 11.45am sharp**.

The briefing for the Poker Run will start at 12.20pm, and commence at 12.30pm.

The Poker Run will have a long and a short course to suit all riders.

There are three rules for this Poker Run:

- 1. Please obey the WA Road Rules.
- 2. Make sure you are wearing correct protective gear.
- 3. Be courteous to all other riders, especially when overtaking, safety is a priority.

There are worthwhile prizes for the best and worst hand, which will be presented at the end of the Hillclimb on Sunday.

The Hillclimb is held on Mount Clarence Scenic Drive on Sunday 7th November. Hillclimb Registration Packs will be available at Stirling Terrace on Saturday morning (6th Nov) from 8am till 11.45am, and also at the hill on the Sunday. (Note: There will no distribution of registration packs on the Friday at the rifle club, as in previous years). The event is held on a closed road and gives the opportunity to bring out older motorcycles. It must be emphasised that this is not a race, but a regularity run. All motorcycles licensed or unlicensed must be inspected by their club examiner and issued with a road worthiness certificate. No megaphones or excessively noisy motorcycles will be allowed. Riders will be given a complementary ride before two practice runs, after which their times are given to them. They then nominate a time they are going to do three more runs throughout the day. All riders must attend at least one practice run. Riders will lose points for going too fast or too slow. There is a cut off time of 36 sec's. Riders will be told the first time if they do a run at 36 sec's or less as a warning. No time will be recorded. If they then do it a second time, they will be disqualified for the rest of the day. Once again, normal protective clothing is to be worn, helmets and gloves are essential. No pillion passengers. However, passengers are accepted in the sidecars. **Practice runs will commence at 8am, don't be late. Riders are to be at Mt Clarence by 7am, the riders briefing will commence at 7.30am sharp**.

This event is now in it's 24th year, and has grown from just 16 entries to having to turn riders away. It is a fabulous weekend to make new friends and renew old, and have fun with your bike. See entry form included. This event is open to Pre 1980 motorcycles, and entry is invited from members of Vintage & Classic and kindred motorcycle clubs. It is restricted to the first 100 riders who have their entries in by the 22nd October 2010. Unsuccessful entrants will have their monies refunded.
